### The mission of The United Methodist Church is "make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

At Brecksville United Methodist Church, we live that out by creating safe spaces to grow with God and one another. But what does that mean? How do we put that into action? As our leadership Board prayed about this, we realized that we needed to start with the basics.

Or current #1 Long-term goal is to develop a discipleship pathway and help 50 people take their next step in discipleship.

So our church staff set to work—how do we create a "discipleship pathway" to describe a spiritual journey that's not a journey? There's not always a clear starting point and it certainly has no end this side of heaven! And it looks different for each of us. Sometimes we may climb a spiritual mountaintop. At other times, we find ourselves in the valley.

### **HONEST WORSHIP:**

### **HONEST WORSHIP: Sundays at 8:30**

Worship on the Lawn: This contemplative service includes hymns, affirmations of faith, and communion each week. As the weather allows, we worship on the lawn - camp chairs and blankets welcome! Last service of the season will be October 6.

Meditative Worship: October 13 through late spring, we move indoors for a worship service focusing on the word of God. Come experience this unique opportunity to "be still and know..."



### **HONEST WORSHIP: Sundays at 10:30**

This energetic service, led by the Worship Band, includes an inspiring message and has additional options for kids - a Children's Moment during the service, and a special program for faith filled learning & fun (Sprouts) after the Children's Moment.



### **HONEST WORSHIP: Online**

Worship live or later! Our services are streamed live to our website, Facebook, YouTube, and Boxcast - with real time chat on our Facebook page. Worship on your own schedule with our video archives. Prefer to take the message with you? We post a podcast every week of the scripture, sermon and prayer time. Listen on SoundCloud or wherever you get your podcasts.

### All Saints Sunday First Sunday in November

This solemn service honors the impact each life has on another. The church bell tolls and a candle is lit as we read the names of each person who has gone on to the church triumphant in the past year.



**Advent Dinner Church** *First Wednesday in Advent, December 4* We make space to pause and center ourselves with a special worship service centered around a shared meal. As the season of waiting begins, we make space for joy.



### Longest Night Service December 21

On the longest night of the year, we pause to honor the grief and anxiety around endings and beginnings. If you have experienced loss, this prayer service can be a balm for the soul.



### Christmas Eve Services 10:30 am, 3 pm, 5 pm, 8 pm

At Christmas, the God of creation takes on flesh: "To you...a savior is born." On this night, God is born, and this God of love knows your name. Each service celebrates the same message in a different way. Our 10:30 am service welcomes the day with carols and a skit by our kids, our 3 service celebrates with carols played on the organ, our 5 service highlights a telling of the Christmas story by our kids, and our 8 service rejoices with a string quintet and our choir.

### Baptism

Through the sacrament of Baptism, we are incorporated into God's mighty acts of salvation and given new birth through water and the Spirit. We receive God's grace in a unique and special way, no matter how old we are or how long we've been worshiping God. Interested in baptism? Please reach out to Pastor Heidi!

### Communion

Communion nourishes and sustains us on the journey. In The United Methodist Church, we observe an open table, which means that all are welcome to participate. Holy Communion is celebrated each week at the 8:30 service and on the first Sunday of the month at the 10:30 service.

### Welcome Team

A spirit of joyful hospitality fills the church on Sunday mornings, and your gifts of warmth and relationship can help create welcome for all who enter Brecksville UMC! Serve once a quarter, once a month or once a week as you're able.

### Liturgists

Communion stewards are integral to celebrating this sacrament. From cutting the bread and pouring the juice to washing communion glasses after the service, preparation of communion elements can be done as a family or with a friend. We celebrate Holy Communion every Sunday at the 8:30 service, and on the first Sunday of the month at the 10:30 service.

### Acolytes





**Lectio Divina** Mondays at 10:30 am in the Chapel



### The Wiggle Room

Kids are always welcome in our worship spaces, but The Wiggle Room is available as another option! Staffed from 8 am until noon on Sundays, it's a safe space for our little ones, infants and up. Each adult is background checked and mindful of allergies and other needs.



### **Sprouts**

Kids in preschool through 6th grade can meet with their teachers on the 4th floor after the Children's Moment at the 10:30 service. It's a time of learning age appropriate Bible stories through craft, cooking, science, games and lots of sensory fun!



**Third Grade Bibles** - Sunday, September 15 at the 10:30 Service Each year, we present our third graders with their very own Bibles - a rite of passage, and a gift of love from the congregation. It is our prayer that this gift will be a starting point for each third grader to develop a deeper relationship with Jesus through the study of God's word.
